Kia ora e te whānau

Our school whakatauāki *Kia eke atu ki Taupaenui o te tangata* challenges each of us to reach our full potential in all our endeavours. Many of our students have been doing this daily and we are so proud of them. If you have been following our Facebook or SchoolApp you will have had the opportunity to see the amazing things our students have been doing; from competing in exchanges, gaining scholarships, attending field trips, engaging in class learning, setting up their own businesses, playing sports and much more. We know the learning journey for each one of them is going to be unique and we are enjoying being part of the learning journey for each of our rangatahi. I hope our wonderful young people keep up the great work as they learn and grow.

As we head to the end of any term it is always important to take time to pause and reflect on where each student is at on their learning journey. This newsletter contains valuable information about what is coming up over the next few weeks.

We will be having a whole school assembly at 2pm on Thursday, 29 June. We have a cultural exchange on this day, a 35-student school orchestra from the Sunshine Coast will be joining us for the day. At our assembly we will have a performance from our visitors as well as from some of our students. We would love for as many whānau as possible to join us for this event.

I have been really impressed with the initiative shown by our student leaders this year. We have recently finished a hugely successful lunchtime competition of 'The Chase' and I know our student leaders have plenty more activities planned soon. Our student leaders have also taken the time to do a survey for the Mayors Task Force for Jobs (MTFJ) group. Results for this survey will be provided to the MTFJ group to inform their planning of careers activities in South Taranaki.

Our senior students have started their Semester Two modules following a busy couple of weeks finishing assessments for their Semester One classes. We have been keeping an eye on senior student's progress and we are really pleased with the progress most of them are making. We can see a good number of Merit and Excellence credits being entered on the system which hopefully will translate to certificate endorsements. If you have a senior student, please monitor your child's progress through parent portal and if you have concerns then please connect with their whānau teacher.

In Term 3, senior students will be offered extra classes after school to support their in-class learning. We will share the schedule for these classes early next term. Options for enrichment will also be shared with students in the next week. Students should think carefully before making their selections for Term 3 to ensure they are on track to gain their NCEA qualifications.

Junior students also have decisions to make on their Term 3 modules prior to the holidays. Module booklets will be available from today. Please discuss the options with your child. It is important that students are covering the breadth of the curriculum throughout the year. If you need further guidance with the selection process, please contact your child's whānau teacher.

Reports for junior students will be handed out at whānau hui meetings on the last day of the term. Reports for junior students will provide curriculum levels for Numeracy, Literacy, Integrated Learning Modules, Flexitime courses and Community Contribution. Whānau hui meetings for junior students will focus on reviewing their goals for Term 2 and setting new goals for Term 3. Module confirmation will also take place at this time. I encourage all whānau to make an appointment with their child's whānau teacher so that they have a clear understanding of the progress their child has been making with their learning. An email will be sent home next week with booking instructions through our School App.

This week we had 11 brave Year 10 students sit the new Numeracy online assessment for NCEA. They are our first students to sit Numeracy under the revised NCEA Change Programme and we are very proud of the work that they have done in their learning classes and with Mr Kumar to prepare for the assessment. Numeracy and Literacy for NCEA will be a corequisite from 2024. Students will need to pass these assessments as well as gain 60 credits at each level to achieve NCEA 1,2 or 3.

These Numeracy and Literacy assessments are administered differently than in the past and it is important that we revise our learning programmes to ensure students are ready to sit these assessments. Students can sit the exams digitally and students can sit the assessments at two points in the year (June and October/November).

Students are also able to sit these assessments when they are ready from Year 9 onwards and must only pass these once. Some of our students will be ready to do this in Year 9 and 10 and others will need to complete as part of their learning programme in the senior school. If students are unsuccessful when sitting this test, they will be given further opportunities in the future once they have had an opportunity to complete further learning. Our literacy and numeracy leads have been closely following information and advice from NZQA and the MoE to ensure we are preparing our students thoroughly for these assessments.

Some schools around the country have been involved in the numeracy and literacy pilot assessments for the last two years and what has become obvious is that those schools who have altered their learning programmes from traditional Maths and English programmes to specific literacy and numeracy programmes were more successful. We will continue to finetune our learning programme to best prepare our students for these new assessments and the literacy and numeracy requirements needed to be successful post school.

The Ministry of Education has a nationwide focus on attendance, and we are thankful for the support of our whānau to ensure that our students are at school every day and on time. Please continue to monitor on parent portal and if you have concerns, please contact your child's whānau teacher. Attendance is a hot topic of conversation now for some of our students wanting to attend the school prom. 80% attendance is required to be eligible to attend.

A major area of concern we have with attendance for some of our senior students is whānau hui time on Monday morning and Friday afternoon. These sessions are vitally important for our senior students as this is when we explicitly teach *The Social and Emotional Learning Curriculum*. This curriculum focuses on key skills and competencies such as good decision making, being self-aware, problem solving, having good self-management skills, working collaboratively, conflict resolution, effective communication, and adaptive decision makers. These were all critical skills identified during the consultation phase of the new school as being vital for our students to acquire prior to joining the work force or transitioning to tertiary education.

The remainder of this term has quite a few changes to our usual school calendar. We will continue to keep you informed as soon as practicable. I would encourage you to keep track of our calendar on parent portal and get in contact with the office if you need further clarification.

Thank you all for your continued support of our school so we can all work together to provide amazing opportunities for our students.




