Kia ora e te whānau

The transition visits for our incoming Year 7 and 9 students started this week. It was great having them onsite learning more about our school and what their learning will look like next year. Each of our feeder schools have two whole day visits this term and families are also welcome to attend our open evenings every Wednesday evening. Tours depart from the school library at 4.00pm, 4.30pm and 5.15pm.

Enrolments for 2025 are well underway. We have close to 100 new enrolments so far. Please keep encouraging people you know to get enrolments in as soon as practicable. The earlier we have these enrolments on the system, the better we can ensure all students are allocated to the right awa, whānau class and learning classes.

Our junior students started on their new mini semester timetable this week. As mentioned in our last newsletter our Year 10 students are transitioning to Bayly Park and our senior school over the next few weeks. Year 7-9 students are focusing on specific learning concepts they need at each of these year levels. Foundations (Literacy and Numeracy) remain each morning as these skills are critical for our students' success but block 2 and 3 have had significant change.

Senior students have started their NCEA examinations. Mrs Reid, our exam centre manager, has reported that they are well prepared and putting their best foot forward. Results will be available mid January. Students who sat the Common Assessment Activities (CAA) Literacy and Numeracy papers in September will have results released by NZQA at the start of December.

Later in the term our junior students are having a week of camps and activities. These camps and activities give our students an opportunity to experience real-world environments, enhance student development, foster key competencies as well as promote our school values of Aotea, Paepae and Taupaenui. We are very thankful for the support that our students receive from their whānau and the wider community to make these camps and activities happen.

Our junior prizegivings are at the end of term on 10 December for Year 9 and 10 students and 11 December for Year 7 and 8 students. Please save this date. We are looking forward to you all joining us.

Government announces changes to school lunch programme

The Government announced changes to Ka Ora, Ka Ako | Healthy School Lunches programme.

Students will continue to receive nutritious meals they know and love, helping them to learn and thrive at school.

From Term 1 next year, our lunches will be provided by the School Lunch Collective, led by Compass Group and supported by a number of food manufacturers and suppliers. These hot and cold meals will be delivered daily and will meet the same nutrition standards as our current lunches.

Our ākonga in years 0-8 will receive a 240-gram lunch, the same size our learners in years 4-8 currently receive. Students in years 9 will receive a meal of at least 300 grams.

There are no changes for our ākonga with complex special dietary requirements. Their meals will continue and will be funded at the current settings.
