## Te Paepae o Aotea Parent Board of Trustees Elections

The Establishment Board of Trustees (EBoT) applied for an alternative constitution, but the Minister of Education has declined this application. While the EBoT does not agree with this decision and this is not the desired outcome, the EBoT is committed to moving the school forward. Therefore, the school will transition to an elected board, with the timing of the new board coinciding with Matariki. The EBoT has valued its nga iwi partnership through the establishment phase of the school, which has set the school on a positive pathway. The New Zealand School Board Association will run board sessions for the community prior to the elections for potential board members.

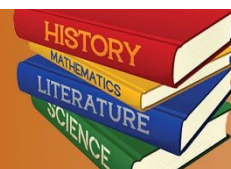

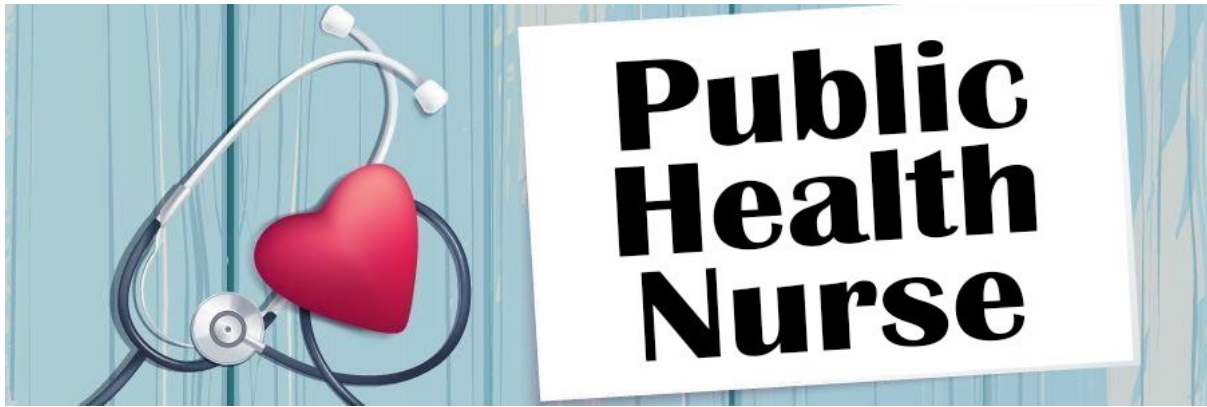
