This term our students have excelled both academically and across a wide range of extra-curricular activities. Winter sports are now beyond the halfway point of their season and our teams have represented the school with pride and determination. Weekly results and draws are available on our school app and Facebook page. Our students thrive when supported by the wider community—we warmly encourage you to come along and cheer them on.

A major highlight of the term was our school production of *Into the Woods JR*. This event provided a wonderful opportunity for students to showcase their talents in performance, production and teamwork. I was incredibly proud of the students, staff and community members involved. The final product was outstanding and it was heartening to see the theatre nearly full for every performance.

Attendance continues to be a national focus and we are pleased to share that our daily attendance rate across all year levels is 88%. We have also seen a significant increase—20% from last year—in the percentage of students attending school 90% or more of the time.

This week, we officially welcomed our elected school board with a pōwhiri on Wednesday morning. Their first board meeting was held last night, so it's been straight to work for them. Thank you to everyone in our community who took the time to vote and a huge congratulations to all candidates. It is never easy putting yourself forward and I commend everyone who was brave enough to do so.

Our senior students have completed, on average, 39% of their NCEA standards for the year, with an impressive average pass rate of 92% across the school. Congratulations to the 14 Year 13 students who already have Level 3, the 18 Year 12 students who have achieved Level 2 and the 10 Year 11 students who have gained Level 1. It's fantastic to see students working hard and achieving their qualifications.

Recently, we hosted the Senior Ball—a memorable occasion for our senior students to come together and celebrate their journey through school. As always, the vehicle entrance was a highlight and we hope you enjoy the photos from this special evening.

# Community Health Update: Keeping Our Tamariki Well This Winter

As the colder months settle in and more of us are spending time indoors, Taranaki District Health Board (TDHB) has reported an increase in common community health concerns such as **scabies**, **head lice** and **impetigo (school sores)**.

These conditions spread easily, especially in close-contact environments like homes and schools. Students cannot be at school if they are contagious. We encourage all whānau to be vigilant:

- Check regularly for signs of head lice and treat promptly.
- Keep an eye out for itchy rashes or sores that may indicate scabies or impetigo.
- Seek medical advice if anyone in your household has a sore throat, especially if it persists this can help prevent more serious illnesses like rheumatic fever.

If you're unsure about symptoms or need support, please contact your GP or local health provider.
