The webspace includes 'parent-friendly' versions of both The New Zealand Curriculum and Te Marautanga of Aotearoa.



Community Health Update: Keeping Our Tamariki Well This Winter

As the colder months settle in and more of us are spending time indoors, Taranaki District Health Board (TDHB) has reported an increase in common community health concerns such as **scabies**, **head lice** and **impetigo** (school sores).

These conditions spread easily, especially in close-contact environments like homes and schools. Students cannot be at school if they are contagious. We encourage all whānau to be vigilant:

- Check regularly for signs of head lice and treat promptly.
- Keep an eye out for itchy rashes or sores that may indicate scabies or impetigo.
- Seek medical advice if anyone in your household has a sore throat, especially if it persists—this can help prevent more serious illnesses like rheumatic fever.

If you're unsure about symptoms or need support, please contact your GP or local health provider. Let's work together to keep our school community healthy and thriving this winter!












Double win and new career direction for Tawhaiti Brown







Double win and new career direction for Taranaki Teen "The Defence Force is my plan A now", says 16-year-old Te Whaiti Brown of Te Pae Pae o Aotea, who has changed his career path after his award wins at Blue Light's Life Skills Camp in Trentham from 28 July – 1 August 2025.

"From doing the Leadership and Life Skills camps with Blue Light, it has got me seriously thinking about a career in the army," Te Whaiti says. "I'm really keen to do the six-week LSV course and apply for the army, where I'd like to get a trade... Before this, I was thinking of going into farming".

Despite not seeking recognition, Te Whaiti walked away with two out of the three top awards – Overall Excellence and the Peers' Choice Award. "I wasn't there for awards. I just wanted to learn things that would

help me in life. I was looking at the other people (fellow camp participants) who I thought were amazing.

There was this one guy whom I picked for the Peers' Choice Award – he was just so on-point, I was certain he would get it. But then they called out my name, and I was so shocked. Then when I got called out twice, I didn't believe it – I thought they were having me on." Leanne Richards, South Taranaki Blue Light Coordinator, who put Te Whaiti forward for the camp, shared, "Te Whaiti has already proven himself to be an outstanding young man with fantastic people skills and great leadership potential; a solid all-rounder".

For other teens considering the Blue Light's Life Skills Camp, Te Whaiti's advice is, "Just give it a go and see what you get out of it. It's like the name says – you'll develop life skills, like self-discipline and time management. It helps to prepare you for the workforce."

As Te Whaiti looks ahead, he remains focused on his future. "Right now, I'm focused on completing all my NCEA levels. I'd like to spend some time developing my trade skills to see which way I'd like to go. Then LSV and the army. Yeah, I have a new sense of direction now."

Blue Light's Life Skills Camp, run in partnership with the New Zealand Defence Force, provides young people with a unique opportunity to develop confidence, leadership, and resilience. Te Whaiti's story is just one of many where teens discover their strengths and set goals for a brighter future.

This highly successful programme has been run by New Zealand Blue Light in partnership with the NZ Defence Force for the past 14 years and has adventure-based experiential learning as a key part of the programme.

The programme provides 14-17-year-olds with critical life skills such as self-development, self-control, and teamwork that will enable young people to be successful at home, school, communities, and employment.


Up to 12 courses are held each year in Auckland, Trentham, Waiouru, and Burnham locations.


