Every minute in class counts, so keep up the great work and communicate with us early if needed. We are continuing to track our NCEA data closely to ensure our students are well supported in their NCEA journey. This year, we introduced the Marama group — a collection of Year 11–13 students striving to gain Merit and Excellence endorsements. This group is making great progress and across all three NCEA levels we're seeing an increase in Merit and Excellence grades. Once again, it's important that parents stay up to date with their student's progress using MyKAMAR.

Building plans are progressing well. We are currently working with architects and quantity surveyors on solutions and we'll be in a position very soon to share more information with the community.

The webspace includes 'parent-friendly' versions of both The New Zealand Curriculum and Te Marautanga of Aotearoa.





Community Health Update: Keeping Our Tamariki Well This Winter

As the colder months settle in and more of us are spending time indoors, Taranaki District Health Board (TDHB) has reported an increase in common community health concerns such as **scabies**, **head lice** and **impetigo (school sores)**.

These conditions spread easily, especially in close-contact environments like homes and schools. Students cannot be at school if they are contagious. We encourage all whānau to be vigilant:

- Check regularly for signs of head lice and treat promptly.
- Keep an eye out for itchy rashes or sores that may indicate scabies or impetigo.
- Seek medical advice if anyone in your household has a sore throat, especially if it persists—this can help prevent more serious illnesses like rheumatic fever.

If you're unsure about symptoms or need support, please contact your GP or local health provider.

Let's work together to keep our school community healthy and thriving this winter!


This week the sport council ran its first ever pickle ball LRA which had a big turnout every day from students wanting to get involved in the growing sport. We plan to run this again at some point during the term.
