Later in this newsletter, we highlight the academic successes of our senior students. 17 Year 11 students have gained Level 1, 30 Year 12 students have gained Level 2 and 31 Year 13 students have gained Level 3. A good number of students already have, or are on track to gain, Merit and Excellence endorsements. It's been fantastic to see our senior students focused on their learning and achieving the results they deserve. They've been well supported by their whānau and our staff and the old saying, "It takes a village to raise a child," feels especially true.

Recently, there has been a lot of media coverage about upcoming changes in the education sector. As new information becomes available, we'll make sure to share the key updates with you. The big announcement this week concerns proposed changes to NCEA. The Ministry of Education has produced a resource for parents and caregivers: Proposed changes to NCEA: What you need to know as parents and caregivers. Feedback on these proposed changes is now open via the Parent, family and student survey.

To quote the philosopher Heraclitus, "The only constant in life is change,"—a sentiment that feels very fitting in education right now. While many details of the proposed changes are still unknown, our role as adults is to guide our young people through these transitions by showing a willingness to adapt.

The webspace includes 'parent-friendly' versions of both The New Zealand Curriculum and Te Marautanga of Aotearoa.





Community Health Update: Keeping Our Tamariki Well This Winter

As the colder months settle in and more of us are spending time indoors, Taranaki District Health Board (TDHB) has reported an increase in common community health concerns such as **scabies**, **head lice** and **impetigo** (school sores).

These conditions spread easily, especially in close-contact environments like homes and schools. Students cannot be at school if they are contagious. We encourage all whānau to be vigilant:

- Check regularly for signs of head lice and treat promptly.
- Keep an eye out for itchy rashes or sores that may indicate scabies or impetigo.
- Seek medical advice if anyone in your household has a sore throat, especially if it persists—this can help prevent more serious illnesses like rheumatic fever.

If you're unsure about symptoms or need support, please contact your GP or local health provider.

For these and all LRAs, listen out for the notices and the intercom to find out whether you're at lunch or interval if you're a junior or senior.






