Kia ora e te whānau

A massive congratulations to our Netball, Hockey and Basketball teams who represented the school during Winter Tournament Week. All three teams demonstrated courage and school pride throughout the week. I was particularly impressed by their ability to learn and grow through the experience.

A heartfelt thank you to our volunteer coaches and managers—without your support our teams would not be able to compete. Special congratulations to our Junior Basketball team who were outstanding and won their competition. Summer sports will be starting soon. Please encourage your child to sign up at the Sports Office.

Most of our junior students have now selected their end-of-year activities. Charges for these activities have been added to school accounts. I encourage whānau to begin making payments early to ease financial pressure later in the year. Please note that all activity fees must be paid in full prior to the start of Activity Week on 1 December.

Next week, students will sit their Common Assessment Activities (CAA) for Numeracy and Literacy—corequisites for NCEA. This will be the first opportunity for Year 9 students to sit these assessments. Year 10 and 11 students who have not yet passed will also be given another opportunity. If you would like more information, please contact your child's Literacy or Numeracy teacher.

In the final week of term, Year 12 and 13 students will sit their practice exams. Year 11 practice exams will be held at the beginning of Term 4. These exams are essential, as results may be used in the event of an emergency at the end of the year and will also contribute to the selection of top academic awards at Prizegiving.

This week concluded with our Inter-Awa Kapa Haka competition. It was wonderful to see our students perform and challenge themselves in front of the school. A huge congratulations to all students who led in this space—you truly embodied our school value of Paepae. This value supports courage, adventure, strength, persistence and the pursuit of knowledge in the learning environment.

Our Kapa Haka rōpū is currently practicing diligently in preparation for Pae Rangatahi (Regionals) being held in Whanganui on Sunday, 14 September. We warmly encourage whānau and supporters to attend and cheer on our group—it would be wonderful to have a strong support crew present. I had the privilege of watching their practice last weekend and was blown away by the commitment and passion they displayed.

I have begun transition visits to our feeder schools. This is always an exciting time of year. Enrolments this year will be completed online. If you need assistance, please contact the school office. 





Community Health Update: Keeping Our Tamariki Well This Winter

As the colder months settle in and more of us are spending time indoors, Taranaki District Health Board (TDHB) has reported an increase in common community health concerns such as **scabies**, **head lice** and **impetigo** (school sores).

These conditions spread easily, especially in close-contact environments like homes and schools. Students cannot be at school if they are contagious. We encourage all whānau to be vigilant:

- Check regularly for signs of head lice and treat promptly.
- Keep an eye out for itchy rashes or sores that may indicate scabies or impetigo.
- Seek medical advice if anyone in your household has a sore throat, especially if it persists—this can help prevent more serious illnesses like rheumatic fever.
- If you're unsure about symptoms or need support, please contact your GP or local health provider.

Let's work together to keep our school community healthy and thriving this winter.
