We would like to begin by congratulating our students on an excellent start to the term. Our senior students, in particular, have returned with a strong focus on learning, and we are confident this will translate into outstanding internal and external results.

Please note that Year 12 and 13 students will conclude their classes on 29 October, which coincides with the Senior Prizegiving. Their external examinations commence the following week. Year 11 students who are sitting Level 1 English will have their first exam on Tuesday, 11 November. Year 11 students will remain at school until 14 November. This additional class time will support their preparation for external assessments and allow them to complete any remaining internal tasks without undue pressure.

Attendance for senior students during the remainder of the term is absolutely essential. It is critical that they are present to complete their coursework and prepare thoroughly for their examinations.

Junior Camps and Activity Week are scheduled for Week 9 of this term. Charges for these events have been added to school accounts. We encourage whānau to begin making payments early to help ease financial pressure later in the year. Please be reminded that all activity fees must be paid in full prior to the commencement of Activity Week on 1 December.

All transition visits to our feeder schools have now been completed, and enrolments for the upcoming year will be online. If you require assistance, please contact the school office. If you were unable to attend our recent open evening and would like a private or small group tour, we would be happy to arrange one—please reach out to the office. We encourage all members of our community to ensure their students are enrolled as soon as possible to assist with planning for 2026.

Term 4 is always a particularly busy time, and with the recent partial and full strikes, the time we have with our students is more valuable than ever. We will endeavour to keep you informed of any changes to the school calendar as soon as possible. Please monitor the school app and Facebook page for updates.

# JUNIOR STUDENTS YEAR 7-10 2-5 DECEMBER 2025

We're looking forward to our upcoming junior camps and activities — these experiences offer valuable learning opportunities and are a highlight of the school year. We know our students will gain a lot from participating, both socially and educationally.

As we prepare for these events, please be aware of the conditions required to attend any away-from-school activities:

- 1. Attendance must be at least 80% from Term 3.
- 2. Students who have been externally stood down from school during Term 3 and Term 4 are not eligible to participate in off-site activities.

If you have not yet been placed in an activity, please see
Mrs Hopkins during Whānau Hui time. From this point forward,
activity changes are not easily made due to associated costs.
If you believe a change is necessary, please come and discuss
your situation with Mrs Hopkins directly.

Looking ahead, please note that Year 7–10 camps will run every second year, always in odd-numbered years — for example, 2025, 2027.



## **Senior Laptop Returns**

All senior students (Years 11- 13) who have loaned a school laptop must return it on the date of their final exam; or no later than Thursday 27 November (the final exam date).

Please ensure that **chargers are returned with laptops**. All devices should be **handed in to the Main Office**.

This applies **even for students who are returning to Te Paepae o Aotea next year** — all devices need to be collected for servicing and checks.

**Please note:** Laptops not returned by the due date may result in a charge being applied to families to cover the replacement cost.



## Community Health Update: Keeping Our Tamariki Well This Winter

As the colder months settle in and more of us are spending time indoors, Taranaki District Health Board (TDHB) has reported an increase in common community health concerns such as **scabies**, **head lice** and **impetigo** (school sores).

These conditions spread easily, especially in close-contact environments like homes and schools. Students cannot be at school if they are contagious. We encourage all whānau to be vigilant:

- Check regularly for signs of head lice and treat promptly.
- Keep an eye out for itchy rashes or sores that may indicate scabies or impetigo.
- Seek medical advice if anyone in your household has a sore throat, especially if it persists—this can help prevent more serious illnesses like rheumatic fever.
- If you're unsure about symptoms or need support, please contact your GP or local health provider.

Let's work together to keep our school community healthy and thriving this winter.


